

Howard Chapter of NHS Alcohol, Drug, & Tobacco Violation Requirement

The Howard High School Chapter of NHS considers alcohol, drug, or tobacco violation a severe strike against the character pillar. We understand that as a teenager, you might make a poor choice and partake in alcohol, tobacco, or drugs. We would hope you would understand the decision was poor and discontinue that practice. To show that you know the seriousness of your choice, you must first complete a service project your junior year of high school before you make application to NHS your senior year of high school. In addition, certain conditions will be placed on you after acceptance into NHS. Listed below are the requirements and conditions.

1. You must come up with a service project with the topic of teenage alcohol, tobacco, or drug dangers depending on your violation. You will consult with the NHS Adviser and get approval of the service project. You must complete the service project by April 30th of your junior year in order to make application for your senior year.
2. You may not make application to NHS until your senior year and must have first fulfilled the requirements set out by step 1.
 - a. Keep in mind that the NHS application admission is not automatic; you would need to fulfill the standard requirements of any NHS candidate.
3. If admitted into NHS, the following conditions will be in effect:
 - a. You may not hold an NHS office.
 - b. You must maintain high standards of character and leadership. Any incident involving character/leadership during your senior year may result in immediate dismissal from NHS. Please reference the Howard Chapter of NHS dismissal guidelines for more information.
